

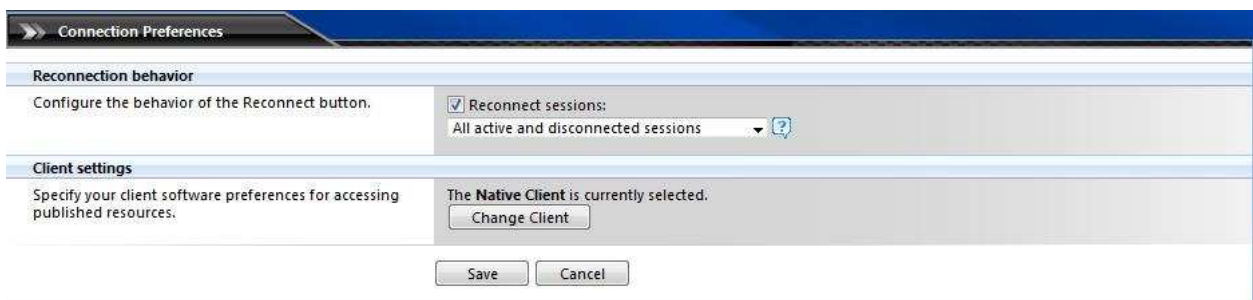
Selecting the Client to Use

If you have installed the ICA client but the Java client is being used or when launching a program you are prompted with the save dialog box then you will need to set your default client.



This can be done by clicking on the “Preferences” Tab as shown

Then Select “Connections Preferences”



From the Clients Window Click on the Change Client button.

The Client Selection Window will allow you to choose between the available Client Options. (Native Client: ICA Windows Client) (Java Client: Multi-platform Client)

Client Explained

Java Client

The Client for Java is platform independent, operating on any computer with a Java-compatible Web browser, and is temporarily installed for the current session only. It is commonly used when the native client is not supported or unavailable and in environments where computers are locked down, such as hotel business centers, public kiosks, or Internet cafes.

Citrix recommends you use the Client for Java if you do not have a local client installed, if you are unsure about which client to use, if you are using a modem, or if you do not have sufficient permissions to install software on your computer.

You must allow pop-ups in order to use this client.

Native Client is recommended for Windows and the Client for Java recommended for Linux and Mac.
